Dear Congregation,

Over 130 years ago, Robert Johnstone of Scotland highlighted a trend in the Church of England wherein precision in doctrine was deemphasized so that “holders of all shades of belief” could feel comfortable in the church. He also spoke of a “Broad School” of religious thinkers who suggested “that religion is but little a matter of the understanding, but almost solely of the heart.” In response to this kind of thinking he said,

When put forward to depreciate the importance of knowing and cherishing doctrinal truth, propositions of the kind I have quoted rest on a false assumption—this, namely, that apart from the perception and belief of truth by the mind, the heart can become pure, and loving, and holy before God. Now, according to the plain teaching of such passages of Scripture as that before us [James 5.19-20]—according to the whole tenor of Scripture indeed, as well as the declarations of experience—the knowledge and belief of certain grand truths are absolutely needful to produce holy affections. The man who has Jesus in his heart has ‘the truth;’ but Jesus enters the seat of the affections through the mind—through the intelligent belief of such truth regarding Him as dispels the atmosphere of falsehood which by nature filled the whole soul. ‘If ye continue in My word,’ said Jesus, ‘then are ye My disciples indeed; and ye shall know the truth, and *the truth shall make you free.*’ It is plainly implied that nothing else can.

What a compelling response Johnstone had to such trends in his day, and how easy it is to see the same kind of trends in the church of our day. Too many well-meaning people are looking for spiritual transformation through emotional experiences. In teaching and preaching, then, the mind is bypassed and the heart becomes the sole object of the message. But Scripture is so clear: true spiritual transformation happens when *the mind* is renewed (Romans 12.1-2). The affections can only be ignited for God when the mind has first been filled with God’s truth. Truth is what truly transforms us (John 17.17). No wonder Jesus said, “For this I have been born, and for this I have come into the world, to testify to the truth” (John 18.37). With the apostle John, then, we should be able to say, “I have no greater joy than this, to hear of my children walking in the truth” (3 John 1.4).
