

OUR CHURCH HISTORY - PART FIVE


Last time we left off in 1965. That was the year that Bob Piete's mom became a member of our church. The year before, in 1964, Leta and Cathy Dowell became members, and Cathy was elected the Sunday school secretary, an office she held for many years. Today we know Cathy as "Susie" Beam. Also in 1964 the congregation voted to withdraw from The Assemblies of God affiliation and become a non-denominational community church. With the decision to build a new sanctuary, the congregation began the tasks before them with great energy. They began several fund raising activities, with Beryl Elmore and Leta Dowell heading up the Fund Raising Committee. They opened a "Country Store" as a part of the fund raising efforts and sold fruit and garden produce, canned and preserved goodies, and fresh butchered meat. They often had community dinners and sold tickets for \$1.00 a plate. Local 4-H kids sold their calves and pigs for the church and the entire community supported this effort in many ways, including by providing skilled labor, materials, and many hours of labor. Pastor Gapen told me he was so very thankful for the way the locals support our congregation, including many he said he could never get to come to a Sunday service. In 1968 the Country Store had a profit of \$2434.14, and through 1972 it raised over \$6400 for the new church. In 1968 they were given a \$10,000 loan to finish the construction and with that money ordered and installed windows, doors, furnaces, and did the plastering. In 1969 they did final ground work and put in the trim and the carpet. Susie, do we still have the original carpet? As of December 1969, they had spent \$35,588.45 on the construction, and the final budget entry I saw was for December 1971 at \$43,869.29 total cost for the new church. In 1972 the church had 41 official members and after all of the construction in December of 1972 they had a balance of \$972.76 in the general fund. Also, in 1972 Pastor Gapen took his first vacation since coming to our church in 1951. The entry says he and Mable took 10 days and "went up north". In all the notes, I did not see any record of when they had their first Sunday service in the new church. That first service most likely was in 1969, as I have heard they started using the sanctuary before there were doors and windows. What happened to "the little cabin on the hill"? In the early 1960's it was being rented to George Lunuford for \$80 a year, which was the amount of the annual income tax for renting it. In 1968 it was removed from the tax listings and moved off site. This brings us to the end of these wonderful old record books. They are being stored in a fire proof box here at the church. The last record is for the annual meeting on January 22, 1973. Pastor Gapen and Mable stayed with us until 1980. They were followed by Pastor Ken and Barbara Schubert, who were here from 1980 until 1999. Ken and Barbara still visit us from time to time and were home in our area this summer. They have now gone back to Colorado for the winter to be near their family. Pastor Kurt Krowel next came to be our Pastor, and with his wife and two children, was here from 1999 until 2006. And that brings us current in this time line to our present Pastor, and six people we all have come to know and love dearly. Brian, Kelly, and their now four girls joined our church family in October of 2007. God has so richly blessed our little church on the hill for all these years with such wonderful Pastors.
